#### Macrocarpa Trees

A prominent feature of our school grounds for many years has been the large macrocarpa trees which line the top of the hill beside Roberts Avenue on our southern boundary. In truth, they were the single most terrifying thing when I took over as principal in 2011! That may sound like an odd statement but if you have been a resident of Bayswater for any length of time, you will have noticed that they have regularly lost limbs over the years.

The main problem with the trees is that they are quite unstable. Over the years, the various Boards of Trustees have done their utmost to ensure they are safe but no matter how often we call in the arborists to prune and trim them, with the next gust of wind, more limbs fail. Those of you who have had children at the school for a few years will remember the storms which have brought whole trees crashing down.

After all we have done to maintain the trees, we have now been advised that it is time to let them go. Over the summer holidays, the trees will be removed. I know some of you will be sad but we will take this as an opportunity to rethink the planting in this area. If you have a great idea, let us know your thoughts.


