Tomorrow's Schools – have your say A message from the Taskforce:

The report by the Tomorrow's Schools Independent Taskforce Our Schooling Futures: Stronger Together \ Whiria Ngā Kura Tūātinitini was released in December 2018. The Independent Taskforce is now very keen to receive feedback from as many people as possible to help complete their final recommendations.

Public consultation on the report is now open and we really encourage school staff, board members, PTA members, parents, whanau and the wider school community to have their say on the future of our schooling system....

Summer Sports at Bayswater



Over the last few weeks, children across the school have been having tennis coaching. Later this week, the children in Whānau Kokoru (senior school) will be trying out cricket.

Next week, on Tuesday 5th March, we are having our school swimming sports. The children in Whānau Puna (juniors) will be demonstrating what they have been learning in swimming lessons this term and the children in Whānau Wai (middles) and Kokoru (seniors) will have a mixture of competitive and noncompetitive events to enter. Those keen swimmers amongst them, have the chance to go through to the Peninsula Swimming Sports on 19th March. The older children will be swimming in the morning and the juniors in the afternoon. Whānau are very welcome to attend.

The school sees swimming as an important aspect of the Health and PE curriculum and lessons will continue as long as the weather permits. Teachers will be upskilling with some onside coaching of their teaching next month. Alongside the school's swimming programme, Waterwise, which teaches water safety in the context of learning to sail, to children in Year 6 also started last week. Children have completed their capsize tests and will begin the exciting task of learning to sail their own Opti tomorrow. They are truly following in the wake of Sir Peter Blake, who attended our school as a child and also learnt to sail down at Narrow Neck Beach.
