Building Work at School

As everyone is aware, the front block is being refurbished at the moment. We apologise for the inconvenience this is inevitably causing. The building work entails opening up and refurbishing two of the small rooms on the south side of the corridor so that they can be used for group work. Windows are going to be added from the classrooms into the corridor, to brighten up the space and allow for a visual connection between the group work spaces and the classrooms. Half the sinks are being removed and space for doors between classrooms made to enable classes to work together when desired. All the carpets will be replaced, as will the wall linings, which will be changed to Autex. The new carpets and Autex will improve the acoustics of the classrooms, corridor and group work spaces.

The builders, who so far have been working very quickly and efficiently, are hoping to complete the first phase (Rooms 1 to 3 and associated corridor) during the next school holidays and the second phase (Rooms 4 to 6 and associated corridor) by the holidays after the third term.

Measles in Auckland schools

Please vaccinate your child or young person if they have not had one measles (MMR) vaccine. It is free at your GP.

Students in a class with someone who has measles may be asked to stay home for one to two weeks, if they have had no MMR vaccinations.

Students with one or more MMR vaccinations can still attend school.

Check your child's immunisation records in their Well Child/Tamariki Ora book or ring your GP clinic.

Tell your GP or after hours clinic if you suspect measles before you arrive, so you don't infect others.

Symptoms: cough, runny nose, fever, sore red eyes, then a rash.
