Health and Safety

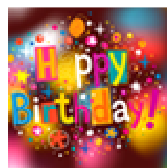

The focus is usually a natural event eg earthquake, cross dog in the playground or some stinging bees.

If you have a fridge with a small freezer, which you no longer need, please let us know and we will take it off your hands!

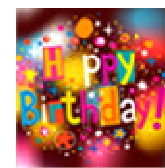
