Louis Vuitton challenger elimination regatta. This gave them the chance to challenge for the America's Cup, which they went on to win and bring home for New Zealand.

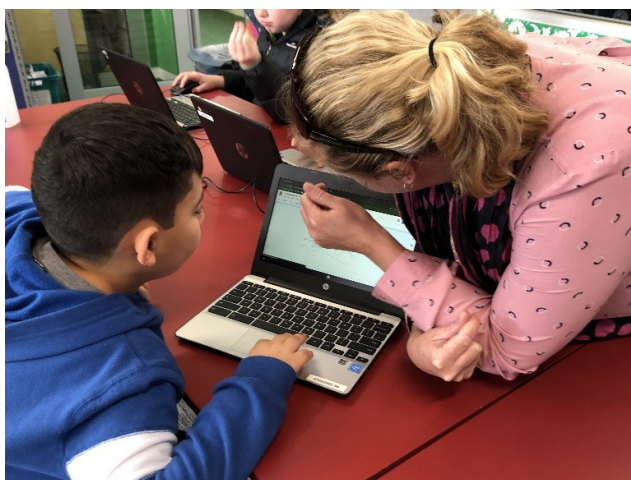
The newspaper is in great condition and is a lovely treasure for our school. Many thanks to Vauxhall School for letting us have it. We will find a creative way to display it for all to see.

Two weeks before Matariki, the Enviro Group tagged the trees blue if they were hidden by weeds. They also tagged sticks with orange if the trees had died.

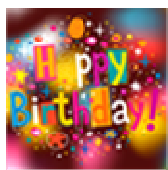
Once again the enviro group worked with Lance Cablk (Programme Coordinator, restoring Takarunga Hauraki) on the Te Korowai o Papatūānuku.

Some of the long grass was weeded with a weed eater and some new trees and shrubs were planted.

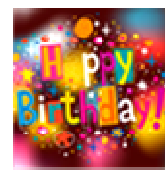
Lily and Elias were two of the children who planted at the Matariki festival.
