
It was exciting to meet as a whole school for assembly on Monday and we now look forward to having whānau join us for a **real-life** Whānau hui on Friday at 9am!

This week is Pink Shirt Week and as our saying for this week says, we are learning to stand together to stop bullying. An Upstander is someone who takes action when they see bullying occurring. There are five Upstander actions:

- 1. Awhi / support the person being bullied, let them know they're not alone;
- 2. Distract / interrupt the bullying somehow by suggesting another activity or helping them to leave the situation;
- 3. Call It! If you feel safe to, let the person/s doing the bullying know it's not OK;
- 4. Leave and act if you don't feel safe stepping in, move away and catch-up with the person later. This lets them know that you saw what was happening and that you want to help;
- 5. Get some other help. Support the person being bullied to get help from others. This could be any adult they trust.


