### Mathematics at Bayswater School

Mathematics and Statistics (generally called Mathematics) in the NZ Curriculum: Mathematics is the exploration and use of patterns and relationships in quantities, space, and time. Statistics is the exploration and use of patterns and relationships in data. These two disciplines are related but different ways of thinking and of solving problems. Both equip students with effective means for investigating, interpreting, explaining, and making sense of the world in which they live.

At Bayswater a portion of each day has a mathematics focus, usually around one hour depending on the year level. As well as these set times we also draw on and increase our mathematical understanding through different contexts in science and technology, social sciences, health and PE and The Arts.

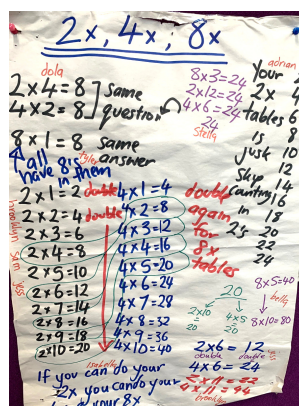
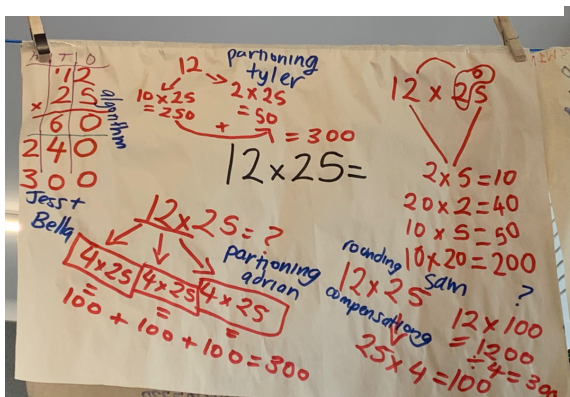
At Bayswater School we use a Problem Solving Approach in which children are given real life problems to solve. They must first understand the problem, see the maths in the problem, share ideas and possible methods and solutions, justify their thinking, prove their theory as well as demonstrate, disagree and discuss their findings. The other key part is the engagement of children in a range of activities to increase their knowledge base including place value and basic facts. We aim to develop mathematicians who are critical thinkers and problem solvers. In 'the old days' we were taught one method to solve equations however nowadays we teach a range of strategies and children are then able to choose the best strategy to solve a given problem.

As with literacy Bayswater School children are respected as individuals; meaning they are taught at their level and each having their own goals, and preferred style of learning that allows them to attain Personal Excellence, one of our Bayswater values. In any one classroom the expectations can range from Level One (Year 1/2 expectations) to Level Four (Year 7/8 expectations) of the curriculum. Whole class generic worksheets (everyone does the same) are kept to a minimum; meaning children are more engaged, everyone can experience success, and creativity and resilience are encouraged! Teachers spend much of each session working with groups and individuals challenging them to think critically and to achieve their goals.

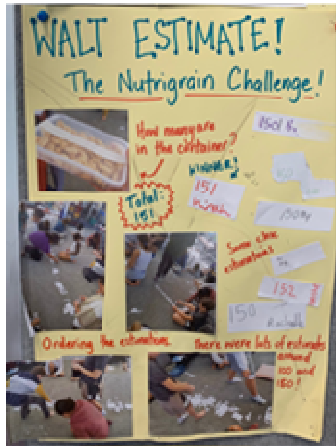

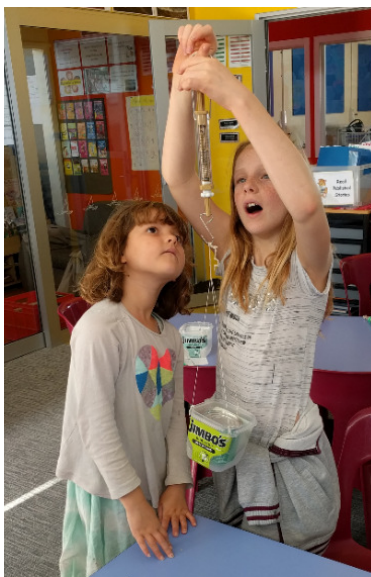

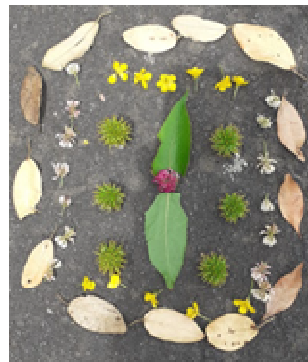

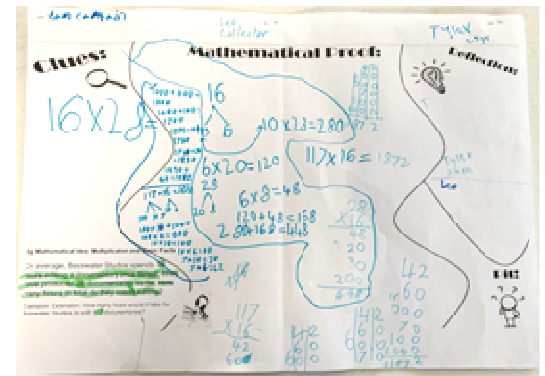

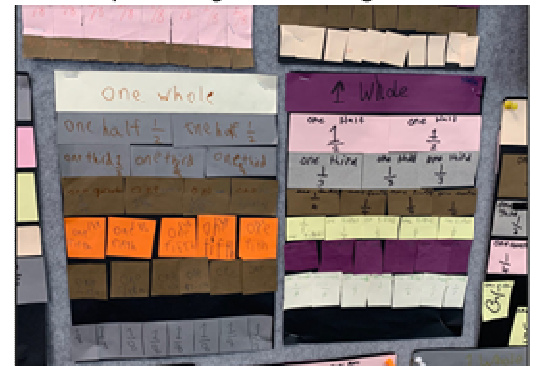

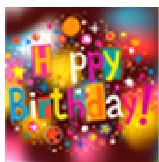


### Sibling Enrolments

Similarly, if you are leaving Bayswater at the end of this year and not returning in 2020 we would appreciate knowing this in advance.

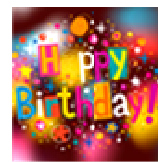

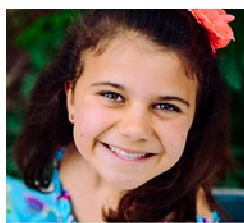

Ready to close off 2020? Yes, it's that time of year already! Please support 1st Devonport Scout Group this Christmas by buying your tree from us.

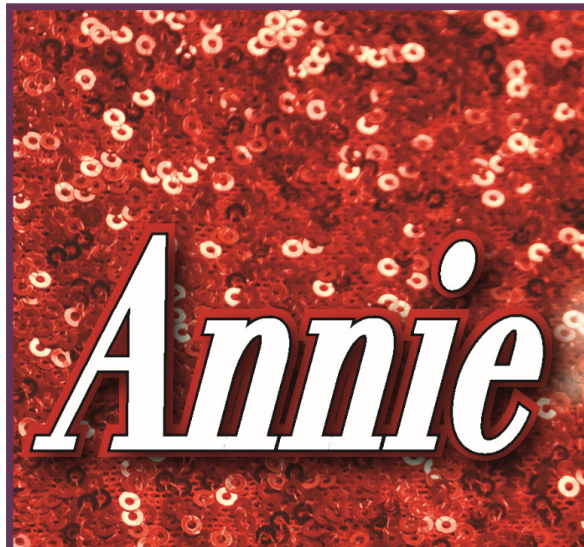
