Art Exhibition

Isn't it exciting to be able to go up to a child's artwork, scan the QR code and hear them talk about their art, view a video or read their explanation!

In the New Zealand Curriculum (NZC) Visual Arts achievement objectives include 1. investigate and develop visual ideas in response to a variety of motivations, in this case it was the listening to, reading and retelling of stories about the formation of our New Zealand landscape and 2. describe and share the ideas their images communicate - found by listening to the children sharing through scanning the code. Furthermore this activity connects to the NZC English curriculum in which children make meaning of ideas they receive through listening, reading and viewing, and then create meaning for themselves or others through speaking, writing and presenting! How busy learning they have all been!

Maths Week challenges

Maths Week is a New Zealand wide event in which classes participate in a set of problem solving activities. The activities are found online and many tamariki from all over NZ participate! At Bayswater School we also have a set of home challenges for tamariki to engage with their whānau during the week. It is great to see many families take the opportunity to learn and consolidate skills along with their tamariki. There was so much maths to be seen! The following are a few examples:

Elias and his family made a scale model of a Tiger Moth and drew a scale diagram showing the length of each part. Bastian and his family found out about all sorts of things that 'fly' and included measurements and fun facts in his presentation. Maria made four different darts, completed a table of results and drew graphs to represent her findings.
