Community Consultation 2023

We will be conducting a schoolwide survey in the next few months. To ensure we get the best information from our whānau we will be holding an Information Evening on Monday 13 March. Our last consultation (2020) showed a clear need for us to share with you, our whānau, what teaching and learning looks like at Bayswater

School. For some this is a very different experience than when you went to school! In 2021 we held our first information evening with a focus on the NZ Curriculum and what happens on a typical day at school, in 2022 we focussed on literacy and numeracy. This year we will share what each of the eight curriculum areas looks like at Bayswater School. This knowledge will not only help you better understand what each curriculum area involves but will also enable you to complete our survey with confidence. Each whānau group's session will focus on their level of the curriculum. There will be two sessions at each level so you can attend both if you have children in each group. We look forward to seeing you all there!


Guitar and Ukulele Lessons
