The winning class was Room 9 who, as you can see, enjoyed their pizza lunch!



Behind the Scenes Visit to Auckland Transport Centres

Last Wednesday the Year 5 children went to Britomart and Smales Farm to see how Auckland Transport works.

We went behind the scenes learning about the train and bus networks e.g. how they vary the number of carriages on a train depending on the time of day.


We found out that AT has over 1600 cameras operating in Auckland. These are to monitor the traffic so they can then warn people using their electronic screens, and turn the lights on and off to allow the motorways to flow.

St Johns First Aid Course at Hauraki School

Bayswater School parents have been invited to join in to complete a first aid course which focuses on helping children. Run by a trained instructor from St John's. The Child First Aid training course covers common first aid emergencies experienced by children and includes NZQA unit standard 25459. Trying to help an injured or seriously unwell child can be frightening and difficult if you don't know what to do. This course teaches you how to cope with injuries that commonly happen to children. It also discusses how to identify and deal with serious illness and life-threatening medical emergencies. The course emphasises practical skills in an interesting, interactive learning environment.
