

Reporting to Parents and Whānau

Your child will bring home his or her end of year, summative report on Friday 15th December. This is a summary of your child's learning this year. If your child is in Y4, 5 or 6 they will also receive a National Standards report, showing progress and achievement in relation to the standards. Children in Years 1, 2 and 3 who first started school in term four or the start of term one will also receive a NS report. The report also contains a summary of your child's attendance and punctuality.

Whilst discussing and moderating our Overall Teacher Judgements it becomes very apparent that it is often the case that children who fail to attend school regularly, also fail to make expected progress. It is very sad to see these children struggling to keep up with their peers when, with more regular attendance, they would do so with ease. If you have struggled to get your child to school every day (except when they are sick, of course) then please contact us early next year to see what we can do to help.



Another issue for many of our children is persistent lateness. If a child arrives at school after the bell, they start the day at a disadvantage. If they arrive after instructions for activities have been given, they are already confused before they even start their learning. It also has a huge impact socially, with children missing out on opportunities to socialise and chat with their friends.

If you have a problem getting your child to school on time every day, please mention this to us. Maybe someone else lives nearby and you could take turns getting the kids to school or maybe a walking school bus route passes your door.

If you have questions when you receive your child's report, please call in to talk to your child's teacher.

Tuakana Teina Writing

This year, Claire Edwards and Linda McPhail ran a pilot tuakana-teina writing programme. This involved some capable writers in Year 5 being specifically trained to work alongside some writers in Y2. We decided to trial this as there is compelling research evidence that this kind of programme brings benefits not only to the younger children who are being helped but also to the older students involved. It seems that having to think carefully about and articulate what it is that skilled writers do, benefits both of the children involved. The pilot project was successful and we hope to run it again next year.
