### Sad News

It is with sadness that I inform you that Coral Dickie died peacefully in the early hours of Saturday morning. Coral, and her family, have had a long association with Bayswater School. Coral worked as a Teacher Aide from 2007 until she was taken ill in 2016. During her time at Bayswater, she worked with many children and supported them in their learning. Coral was a hugely conscientious and dedicated educational professional, always taking on new learning, studying in her own time for a TA qualification and always being thoughtful and reflective. The children who were supported by her were lucky to benefit from her dedication and experience.

As well as her work with children, Coral was a wonderful colleague. One of her most fabulous attributes was the simple but often over looked quality of kindness. It is impossible to count the innumerable acts of Coral's kindness: knitting a shawl for a pregnant colleague's baby; giving a plant to a bereaved colleague; creating flower arrangements for the office staff; hugs and words of wisdom for a distressed colleague.

Throughout her time at Bayswater, Coral was devoted to her own grandchildren, Sophia, Amelia and Billy, always supporting their sporting endeavours and other activities. She also supported school events, alongside her daughter Susan and son-in-law Gavin, both of whom were great stalwarts of Bayswater School Parent Group's fundraising efforts and social activities.

Of course Coral will be missed by her family and we send our love to them all. She will also be sadly missed and fondly remembered by all of us at Bayswater School.



## IMPORTANT NOTICE

### Notice of School Closing 15th August

School will be closed on Wednesday 15th August as almost all of the teaching staff and the principal will be taking action in support of their negotiations with the Ministry of Education. This means that children will need to be kept home for the day. The decision to close the school has been made by the Board of Trustees and is to ensure the safety of all children.

The main points of the teachers' and principals' claims are concerned with recruitment and retention of quality teachers and support for children with additional needs.

We are fortunate at Bayswater School to have a settled and committed staff. This is not the case in all schools, some of which have not been able to recruit suitable teachers and have had to split classes bringing numbers up to 45 children in one class. Even we have experienced difficulties in the recent past, covering parental leave and roll growth classes. We currently have difficulty finding relievers to cover classes when teachers are sick or away on courses.

Bayswater is an inclusive school and welcomes children of all achievement levels and physical abilities. This can present challenges when insufficient support is available to address the needs of some of our children. They miss out on valuable learning and staff are placed under additional stress.

The Board of Trustees and the teachers appreciate that the day of action will inconvenience many families. We have been informed by Kelly Club that they will be open during the day.


