End of Year Reports

On Thursday, after prize-giving, the children will receive their end of year reports and class placements for 2017. As always, we will be informing children of their new class during the day. They will have an opportunity to visit their new room and teacher, along with their new classmates earlier that day.

The end of year report format will be familiar to most of you, as it is unchanged from last year. Those who receive a National Standards report will find a slight change in the format this year. The columns (running down the page) represent the child's current year group (ie the class or year group they are in) and the rows (running across the page) represent the achievement level. The blue boxes are where the year group and the achievement are the same eg a child at the end of Year 4 and achievement at the standard for the end of Year 4. If the X is within the blue box, the child is achieving at the National Standard. If the X is above the blue box, they are achieving above standard and if it is below the box then they are achieving below the standard.

The difference for some of you this year is that in the past we made an attempt to fine tune the system to show where within the standard the child had achieved. After much deliberation, moderation and consultation with other schools, we have decided to make the system simpler and now have no gradations within the blue box. The X is either in the blue box or not.

When you receive your child's report, take some time with your child to discuss the contents. It is not advisable to open and discuss the report publically whilst still at school. It is better to take it home and share it with your child in the calm and relaxed surroundings of home.

Surf Life Saving City Nippers Holiday Programmes – Registrations Open

This Auckland-based programme introduces primary school-aged children to the open-water environment and builds their confidence in the sea by teaching them fundamental water safety skills.

Courses are run at St Heliers, Takapuna, Onehunga, Maraetai and Bucklands Beach.

The courses consist of five fun-filled two-hour beach sessions in which qualified Surf Lifeguards teach children water safety rules, and coaching surf sports on the beach and water safety skills in the sea. Activities include:

- wading and duck-diving in the water
- how to use a body board correctly
- going around buoys
- running races on sand, beach flags
- · education on surf safety, sun smart, rips and waves
