
New Blinds in Hall and Staff Room

New Bell Times and Food in School


As you may remember, we were trailing some new bell times last term. We have decided to stick with two breaks of equal length, rather than a short morning tea and a longer lunch. The start and end of school will remain the same but children will be breaking for a half hour play at 11, followed by morning tea eating at 11:30am. They will break for lunch at 1:10 and then have another half an hour to play, finishing at 1:50pm.

Although children are only required to sit for ten minutes to eat at lunchtime, they are encouraged to remain eating for as long as they need or would like to. The time between the start of school and the first chance to eat is quite long, and we are also mindful of the fact that some children will have had breakfast much earlier in the day. Because of this, Whānau Puna (junior school) will continue to break for 'brain snack' or 'feed and read' at around 10am. Whānau Wai and Kokoru (middles and seniors) have introduced their own brain snack, which can be taken by the child when needed during the first block. Brain snack or feed and read should be something small and healthy, which does not make a mess or require utensils! Suggestions are a piece of fruit, a handful of raisins or some carrot sticks. Milk will still be available for those who would like it, shortly before the 8:55am bell.

Macrocarpa Trees

You will all have noticed that over the summer the macrocarpa trees along our southern boundary were felled. Those of you who have been associated with the school for any length of time will know that the trees had become increasingly dangerous over the past few years. The Board of Trustees regularly engaged arborists to prune the trees and ensure loose limbs were removed. Unfortunately, despite this, branches continued to fail and fall from the trees, posing a serious risk to those using the fields and footpath. In the end, we reluctantly followed advice that the only safe option was to remove them.

This now presents us with an exciting opportunity: What to replace them with! The children will be discussing possibilities through their Enviro Group and School Council. They will be contacting the wider community in due course, to hear your ideas. If you are keen to get involved, we would welcome your input.
