#### **Beach Clean-Up!**













On Friday 29th March, our wonderful school community once again came together to participate in the Peninsular beach cleanup. Bayswater children and staff really appreciated the amazing turnout of whānau who supported this annual event. The children arrived at school equipped with their buckets and gloves, ready for an adventure. Very few disposable gloves were called upon.

Many of the children returned to school muddy and tired, but with happy memories, and a feeling that they had made a difference to the environment. We have noticed that there is less overtly visible rubbish each year that we do the beach clean up. This is very reassuring. During a prior presentation from Sustainable Coastlines, the children learned about microplastics and the harmful effect that small pieces of plastic cause in our ecosystems. At the beach clean up, the children demonstrated the Bayswater value of resilience, as they searched for small bits of rubbish. Many of the children spoke about the microplastics that they found during their search. Alice MacLuckie shared, "Sadly, most of the rubbish was micro plastic which is the most dangerous to animals."

The children were not only pleased to share the rubbish they had collected, but were equally as delighted to spot crabs and other living creatures in the mangroves. Brooklyn Carew shared. "I liked that we got to have fun in the environment."



#### **Health and Safety at School**

You may have noticed in the senior corridor, just past the office, there is a health and safety noticeboard. This details the staff members who are St John's trained, the location of our defibrillator (opposite the noticeboard, just outside the sick bay) and information about our Health and Safety Committee.

The first item on every staff admin meeting and the children's school council meetings is always health and safety. The children are first rate at spotting hazards around the school that we, as adults, would probably never notice!

As well as keeping a hazard register of anything which is a potential risk, the school also logs and monitors 'hits and near hits' ie accidents and near accidents which occur on site. These are tracked over time and monitored for patterns and trends. If you are ever in school and notice something which you think might be dangerous, please let us know.

As part of health and safety in school, we have regular evacuation and lock-down practices. Approximately once a year, we also have an earthquake drill – which is the combination of both (starting with a 'lock down' and finishing with an evacuation). When we carry out lock down practices, we are careful not to scare the children and so always use a scenario like a swarm of bees, an extreme weather event or a dangerous dog in the playground. You can see the red and green lock down and evacuation notices around school if you would like to look at these in more detail.






#### **School Closure Last Friday Afternoon**

Please bring in unwanted good quality winter items (adults/kids clothing, duvets, blankets, winter sheets etc.) for the Winter Share in term 2.


Items can be dropped into the office.




## Margaret Mahy's Pirate Adventure hits the stage this school holidays!
