Bully-free New Zealand

In a sad week, when high rates of bullying in New Zealand schools were highlighted by ERO, it is opportune that we had already planned a half term's learning about bullying as part of Pink Shirt Day (Friday 17th). The ERO report states, "Bullying in schools is intolerably high and most children say the strategies they are taught for dealing with bullies do not work." The report goes on to comment that the root of the problem lies beyond the school gate, noting that New Zealand also has poor figures for family and sexual violence and for workplace bullying. "The problem is a societal one. Schools can play a significant part in addressing it, but the responsibility to bring about lasting change is shared by communities, whānau, and individuals across New Zealand."

The children have been learning about bullying over the past two weeks and this will culminate in a celebration of Pink Shirt Day on Friday. Children have been learning about the features of bullying (that it is harmful, deliberate, repeated and occurs where there is an imbalance of power). They have been learning that bullying can take place in different ways: physically or socially and emotionally and in the real world or in cyber space. A very important lesson has been about the role of the upstanders. Upstanders are by-standers who notice that bullying is occurring and who do something about it. This might include being supportive to a friend who has been bullied or seeking help from an adult. We expect children to keep themselves safe, but doing nothing when they know bullying is occurring, is not an option. The children will be sharing their learning about bullying with you shortly.

Building Work

Renovations are due to start on the front block in a couple of weeks. The first phase, involves Rooms 1 to 3 and the adjoining corridor. There will still be access to the foyer through the front of the school but no way via this route through to the back of the school. Children will be asked to walk around the east end of the front block (near the library) or, on arrival at school, to use the little pathway between us and our neighbours in the west corner of the site. This takes them through the bike sheds and past the new block, Room 9. A small portion of the front courts will be fenced off during construction.

Whilst the first phase is going ahead, Whānau Kokoru (the seniors) will be using the two relocatable classrooms on the field and the library as classrooms.

We would really appreciate some adult assistance in moving the contents of the classrooms and taking down displays, as well as moving the contents of the resource rooms. The two days we need help are Monday 20th May (shifting the resource rooms) and Thursday 23rd May (shifting classrooms, including displays). We will be starting both days at 9am. Please let the office or Marianne know if you can help or just turn up on the day!

NZEI Strike

As you have no doubt heard in the news yesterday, the primary teachers and principals have voted for further strike action. This will take place on Wednesday 29th May and will coincide with action by our secondary colleagues in the PPTA. As all but one of our teaching staff are union members, Bayswater School will be closing for the day. I apologise for the inconvenience this will cause you.



As mentioned in last week's newsletter, one of the main issues which teachers are keen to see the Ministry of Education address is support for children with Additional Needs. The current situation is that support for children who need a little bit extra is woefully underfunded. This means that some children miss out altogether on additional help that would benefit them. In addition to this, the school's Board of Trustees has to use its funds for extra support, well beyond what is included in the school's operations grant. There is also inadequate access to specialist staff.

The issue of pay is more vexed but it remains a fact that it is very hard to attract quality staff to schools in Auckland where the cost of living is so high. There was a case of two Auckland schools which had recruited two experienced teachers (a couple) from the UK. When they arrived, ready to start work at their respective schools, they soon realised that they could not afford to live near either. Neither teacher took up their post, moving instead to find work outside Auckland. This left the two schools at the start of the term without teachers for classes. Schools on this peninsula are advertising and re-advertising jobs trying to find suitable applicants. This is a very difficult situation to resolve.
