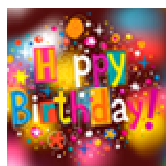




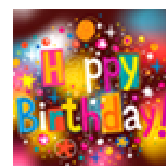


Congratulations to our students who received a certificate at assembly on **Friday** for:-

The children made the following comments about the activity:

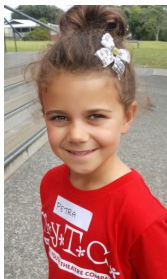
"It was a really fun experience because I got to help Native birds by planting trees" Brooklyn
