

#### **Building News**

You will all have noticed the great progress which has been made on the new senior playground over the holidays. Despite the large amount of rain, lots has been achieved and we are hoping to have it all finished by Wednesday 7th August, when we will have the official opening. We plan to start at 11am and all whānau are welcome to attend. Make sure you wear something suitable for playing in!

Sadly, the same cannot be said for the modernisation of the front block! Although great progress has been made and the builders are bang on schedule, there has been a hold-up with the delivery of the carpet. This has set the project back by a couple of weeks whilst we wait for the container ship to arrive. For the next two to three weeks, the seniors (Whānau Kokoru) are in the old middle school classes, rooms 4, 5 and 6. The middles (Whānau Wai) are in their temporary classrooms (two on the field and one in the library).

Additional accessibility building work has also been started during the holidays. This is mostly around Room 9 and the swimming pool. This will be on-going for a while and may cause some inconvenience for everyone. Thank you all for your patience – it will all be worth it in the end!

#### **Primary Principals' Industrial Action**

Parents and whānau are probably aware that the teacher members of the NZEI settled their negotiations with the Ministry of Education last term. The same was not the case for the principals. Primary principals across the country have voted to reject the government's offer for settlement of our negotiations as the offer did not address the key issues. Unfortunately, primary principalship is not seen as an attractive career option and many schools have huge difficulty attracting suitably qualified and experienced applicants.

Part of the action earlier this year was about winning pay parity with secondary teachers for primary teachers. This was achieved but the same was not offered to primary principals. We think that if parity with secondary is fair for teachers, then surely it's fair for principals.

A second problem with the principals' offer was that some principals in smaller schools are being paid less than some teachers in larger schools. It is important that all communities are able to attract teachers to become principals, and that won't happen if people can earn more as a teacher.

As a sign of our concern we have voted to withdraw the goodwill we extend to the Ministry of Education. This is work which is additional to our day to day role running schools. I will not be participating in any form of work programme, taskforce, meeting with or reporting to the Ministry between July 8 and August 16. I will continue my professional leadership of the school during this time.
