Lockdown Procedures

You may have heard in the media over the past weeks about a review of school and early childhood centre lockdown procedures, in light of the emergency in Christchurch in March of this year.

One of the main findings of the report is that parents and whānau are often confused or completely unaware of school lockdown procedures and their role when a lockdown occurs.

At Bayswater School, we practice lockdown procedure, along with evacuation and earthquake drills, every year. Whenever we carry out these practices, we ensure that the children are not alarmed and always use scenarios which will not unduly scare or stress them. Sometimes we say that we are practising what we would do if a swarm of bees flew by or if there was a cross dog in the playground or an extreme weather event.





When we practice a lockdown, or if ever we went into lockdown for real, we contact all parents via text message and email to state that the school is in lockdown. We advise parents and whānau not to come to school but to monitor the school website for further updates. On the website, there is a dedicated tab for emergency alerts:

This is where we would post updates about what is happening.

During a real lockdown, the police have an open phone line which remains active for the duration and through which we receive instructions, advice and updates. We have been advised that we should maintain the security of the school, irrespective of anyone outside knocking on the door, until we are given the all clear by the police. This was something which caused problems in the Christchurch lockdowns and we are currently awaiting advice from the Ministry of Education. We will keep whānau updated.


