Kids for Kids and Onepoto Cultural Festival

What an amazing week for the performance arts! Children from Whānau Wai and Kokoru represented the school fantastically well at the Kids for Kids choir event at the Bruce Mason Centre on Thursday evening and at the Onepoto Cultural Festival on Friday.

During the day on Thursday, the 62 children in the choir went to the Bruce Mason Centre to rehearse all the new songs which they had spent months learning for the show, Big Aroha. Three of our children also auditioned for solo parts. I would like to acknowledge Maraea Mita who, although not successful on this occasion, put herself forward to audition and was gracious and supportive of other children who were selected. Kia kaha, Maraea, wonderful demonstration of the Bayswater School value of resilience. Maybe next year...!

Stella Bradley was picked to sing a solo part in the song, Stand Up!, and Mirach Ataseven was selected to rap in the song, Big Aroha. Both did themselves, their whānau and Bayswater School very proud. It is hugely impressive to me that they were able to perform confidently to over 1,000 people. The whole show was outstanding and it was lovely to see so many of our children participating and enjoying performing together in a massed choir. Well done to everyone who took part, sang their hearts out and did all the actions with such enthusiasm. Many thanks to teachers Amy and Allison who have been working with the choir all year.

Whaea Ally (our Te Reo Māori teacher and kapa haka tutor for other local schools) watched our performance and commented that she heard lots of positive feedback from others in the audience. One of the things most commented upon is the unique material which we are able to perform, thanks to friends of our school who have composed waitata and haka specifically for us. Thanks once again to Kelly Kahukiwa who wrote Poi o Waikokoru for us and to Temuera Hall and Danny Watson, who developed our school haka for us.

As in the choral performance the evening before, children stepped up and took on leading roles of kaea during the performance. Kleoh McLean was proud to wear the school korowai.

The process took the form of online questionnaires and face-to-face meetings up and down the country. The opinions of specific interest groups (teachers, principals, parents, employers etc) were canvassed, as well as meetings being open to the general public.
