Thank you to our wonderful Parent Group!

This year has been a bumper year for the school with regards to the items which have been funded by our hard working Parent Group. The most obvious single item is, of course, the fantastic new playground which is being enjoyed by our middle and senior school students. A playground like that does not come cheap and it would not have been possible without the Parent Group's contribution of nearly \$70,000. Along with grants and money from the Board of Trustees, it was great to see this project finally come to fruition.



You may be surprised to hear that the playground was not the only item financed by the Parent Group this year. In addition to this, they funded the new basketball hoops, costing nearly \$8,000, on the front courts. As well as being used for school basketball teams to practise, they are well used by the children at morning tea and lunch time with up to 30 children at a time, playing with them. They also purchased some new sports uniforms, at a cost of over \$2,500. These are sometimes used by sports teams but are also worn by children representing the school in events such as Peninsula cross country and athletics competitions.





As well as the children directly, our school buildings have also seen the benefit of Parent Group support. New blinds in the hall and staff room were installed in the last week of last year, at a cost of nearly \$6,000 and lovely new whiteboard storage cabinets were purchased for the refurbished classrooms (Rooms 1 to 6). These were removed from the planned upgrade as the school's property money didn't stretch far enough. Thanks to the Parent Group, we were able to go ahead with their purchase.

Looking forward to 2020, the Parent Group has already donated nearly \$5,000 towards the cost of camp for Whānau Kokoru.

For a small school, our Parent Group punches way above its weight! We are so grateful for all the time and effort put in by members and supporters. There are many opportunities to get involved so please consider joining in 2020.

Donations and Property Money

You may have heard in the news that the government has introduced an initiative whereby schools can opt into a donations scheme funded through the Ministry of Education. This will mean that they no longer need to ask parents to make an annual donation. Unfortunately, this is only open to schools which are decile 1 to 7. As Bayswater School is decile 10, this is not an option for us. For the foreseeable future, therefore, the Bayswater School Board of Trustees will continue to ask parents and whānau for a voluntary, yearly donation. We rely on this donation to meet the basic running costs of the school.

Another matter which has been publicised recently is the injection of hundreds of thousands of dollars for property upgrades. Although this funding is most welcome, as with many such initiatives, the devil is in the detail. Whilst it is true that we will be receiving a sizable sum, there are restrictions on the ways this can be spent.

Firstly, only capital projects like the refurbishment of the front block can be funded through the windfall. This means that the money cannot be used for the school's running costs or maintenance.

A second restriction is that Five Year Agreement (5YA) items have to be financed first. Every school has a 5YA with the Ministry of Education. The 5YA specifies property projects, which have to be tackled in a specific order. We would not be able to spend our new money on any items which sit outside this list of priorities until all of these have been met. The truth is that these items are never completed as the amount of property funding we receive is never quite enough.



We look forward to making some improvements more swiftly than would otherwise have been possible.

Next Wednesday 18th December is outdoor classroom day. Your child will need a complete change of clothing including undies, a towel and a waterproof bag to take wet clothes home.
