Bike and Scooter Safety

In the last week we have had one near miss and another accident because of children and adults riding their bikes through the school grounds. On one occasion, a child riding on the front courts bowled a younger child over at the end of the school day. On another occasion one of our teachers was nearly flattened by a parent cycling through the grounds at speed before school.

The basketball hoops and new senior playground are extremely popular and lots of families hang on at the end of the day make use of them. This is wonderful and is all part of what it means to be a community school. However, we do need to keep people safe. With lots of toddlers around and several pregnant staff members, this is something we need to take seriously.

We are asking parents and whānau to help us. Please remind your child to dismount from their bike or scooter as they ride into or out of the school grounds each morning and afternoon. We would be grateful if parents accompanying their children could support us by doing the same. If you see someone else riding through, please remind them to dismount. We will ring a school bell at 3:15pm each afternoon. After this time, you and your child are welcome to hop on, if it is safe to do so.

Board News

The Bayswater School Board of Trustees met twice during the month of February to work on its Strategic Plan. This was finalised and sent into the Ministry of Education at the start of March. The Strategic Plan outlines the Board's goals for the school and details some of the strategies which will be used to achieve these. As part of our discussion, the board decided it would like to develop an updated 'Leaver Profile'. This is a description of the attributes and dispositions which the school helps children to develop as they move through the school.

The profile should reflect our whānau aspirations for their children - what you, as parents and care givers, dream for your child by the end of their time with us. The profile should also contain a strong element of 'student voice' and reflect the children's desires and dreams for their own progress towards their future.

Look out for Board consultation over the forthcoming few months so that you can have your say on how we should be helping your child to head to a bright future!

Collecting Children Early

We are experiencing lots of disruption, particularly on Friday afternoons, caused by parents and whānau collecting children early from school. Occasionally, when there is an emergency or some unforeseen circumstance, this may happen. Children should not, however, be taken out of school early on a regular basis. We are also concerned that some parents go straight to classrooms and collect children without first signing them out. This presents us with a real health and safety issue.

From now on, if you need to collect a child early for some reason, please go first to the office to sign them out. You will then be asked to go to the classroom to collect your child, with a sign-out card for the teacher so s/he can make sure that your child's absence is recorded correctly in the roll. The Ministry of Education monitors student absences (including early departure from school) each term. It is essential that we record children's reasons for unavoidable absence accurately.



ANZAC Day

Each year, Bayswater School takes a group of children and whānau along to the Devonport ANZAC Day parade and service. This departs from the Devonport New World carpark at 9:45am and proceeds down to the War Memorial near the Devonport library for a 10:00am service. If you would like your child to participate (it is the last weekend of the holidays) please let Lindsay know. We will give each child participating a school t-shirt to wear and select children to carry the school banner and lay the wreath on behalf of us all. We invite an adult to accompany their participating child/ren.






