Children settled into school and were full of chatter about all the learning they had accomplished and experiences they had over the seven weeks away. It is a tribute to whānau to see them return so positively.




















Some children will have felt anxious returning to school; others will have felt sadness at the 'loss' of their bubble, wanting to remain at home; others will have felt excited to see their friends and be back in the familiar surroundings of school. Most will have felt a mixture of emotions. Children, and all of us, need calm brains for optimal learning of new material and to integrate new knowledge and skills with what we already know. Our job, as children return to school, is to get them relaxed and in a calm state so that they are able to learn.

By the afternoon, many of the children (and ALL of the staff!) felt quite sleepy! It will take us all a while to adjust to life back at school and work. It was lovely to see the children relaxed, listening to stories at the end of the day.



Families who are still experiencing some anxiety over sending children back to school, please contact your child's class teacher or me and we will talk through how we can best support you to help get your tamariki back to class.

We realise that everyone has had a different experience of lockdown. At school we are using the analogy of a storm: We have all been in the same storm but in different boats. For some it will have been a fantastic opportunity to reconnect with whānau and take life at a slower pace; for others there will have been real challenges to manage and overcome; for many it will have been a mixture of the two. Some of our families will continue to experience difficulties, especially with changes in employment. If things have been particularly difficult for you, let us know. We can keep a special eye out for your child and may be able to help in other ways too.

We are taking things gently at school, allowing children time and space to reconnect with their friends, classmates and the adults at school. It is important to get back to the learning but it is also vital to give children the opportunity to share some of their experiences of lockdown and tell us about the learning they did over that period of time too.

Drop Off and Pick Up

The children are coping really well with the new arrangements for drop off and pick up at school. Today we made a slight adjustment, to ensure the seniors and middles going home with younger siblings were ready to depart with them, via Roberts Avenue at 3pm.

As there have been none of the anticipated bottlenecks, from tomorrow, we will be welcoming children to school through the Roberts Avenue or Bayswater Avenue gates from 8:40am regardless of whether they are seniors or juniors. From now on, simply drop your child at the most convenient gate. Junior staff will still be at the gates on Roberts Avenue to welcome children and take them to class, so if your junior aged child would still benefit from this, please ensure s/he continues to be dropped off on that side of school.

At home time, we will continue to allow children in the front block (Rooms 1 to 6) to leave school at 2:45pm if we can see their caregiver on Bayswater Avenue. At 3pm, those children who have not been collected, will be released and allowed to make their way to whichever is the most convenient gate for them to leave by. Juniors will continue to be brought to their whānau on Roberts Avenue. If we make any further adjustments to drop off and pick up, we will alert whānau by email and also on the SkoolLoop app.


