Bike Train!

On Wednesdays, many of our children ride to school on the 'bike train'. It is wonderful to see the bike sheds so full and see the kids out and about, getting exercise and doing their bit for the environment.

With the bike sheds being so well used on these days, it soon becomes apparent how tricky they are to use. The space is just too small and the path from the front of the school, down around the staff carpark, is too narrow and twisty. So, we would like to invite you to help us with a little project! We would like to reorganise and improve the bike shed and the area around it.

The first stage would be to demolish the little shed beside the swimming pool fence, move the compost bin and prepare the ground. The second stage would involve pouring a concrete slab which would extend the area where bikes and scooters can be parked and make the whole area more usable by whānau with bikes, buggies, wheelchairs etc. The final stage, and the icing on the cake, would be to roof the whole area so that bikes stay dry on wet days.

Note: this is a free event where anyone can take what they like without the involvement of money.

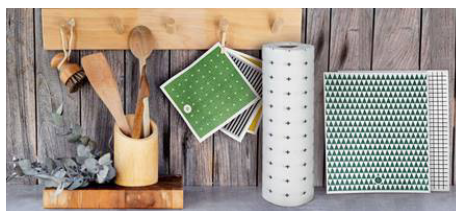
Eco Cloths

Craft Boxes

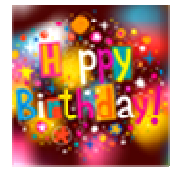

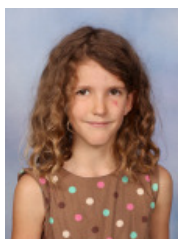
