## Junky Monkeys

The Junky Monkeys' Programme Philosophy aims to counteract the trends of 1. children sitting inside on devices, disconnected from nature, and exhibiting a lack of resilience and increasingly suffering from anxiety and depression and 2. our landfills overflowing with discarded plastic goods, because a 'throw-away' culture has us buying something new rather than repurposing something old. Junky Monkeys repurposes junk (a.k.a. loose parts) into resources for creative play and promotes a cultural shift towards reduce, reuse, recycle. Through their programmes in schools and communities, they aim to: activate play in public spaces and educational settings, engage tamariki, kaiako, and whānau in meaningful waste education, and empower schools and communities to deliver loose parts play experiences.

We have two sessions this week at Bayswater School and two early in 2021 and hope to then set up our own large loose parts play resources during the year. The NZ Curriculum key competencies of thinking, managing self, participating and contributing and relating to others can all be seen when children are given the opportunity to join in with large loose parts creative play!









## Scholastic Book Fair

The theme this year is The Jungle. The library has been decked out to look, and sound, like a jungle, and there are many books on display! The children will have the opportunity during the week to visit and whānau can visit before and after school. The books, posters, toys, stationary are all available to purchase – what great presents books make! You can also choose to purchase a book for the school. A percentage of all sales goes towards purchasing new books for the library.

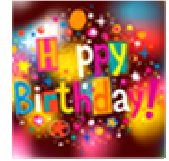
