Literacy at Bayswater School

English (Literacy) in the NZ Curriculum incorporates reading and writing as well as oral and visual language. "By engaging with text-based activities, students become increasingly skilled and sophisticated speakers and listeners, writers and readers, presenters and viewers."

At Bayswater a large portion of each day has a literacy focus. In Whānau Puna (years 1-2) it is for an hour at the start of the day and an hour after morning tea. Whānau Wai (years 3-4) and Whānau Kokoru (year 5-6) have a literacy focus from 9-11am each day. Literacy can also be found throughout the rest of the day as is required to engage in any learning at school. This may be writing an explanation in science, debating who one should vote for in Social Sciences, writing a thank you letter, drawing a diagram in technology, giving a speech about something you're passionate about, sharing a special item at "show and tell", presenting at assembly or writing a description of a special event (see Kiwi Kapers examples below).

At Bayswater School children are respected as individuals meaning they are taught at their level and each having their own goals, and preferred style of learning that allows them to attain Personal Excellence, one of our Bayswater values. In any one classroom the expectations can range from Level One (Y1/2 expectations) to Level Four (Y7/8 expectations) of the curriculum. Whole class generic worksheets (everyone does the same) are kept to a minimum meaning children are more engaged, everyone can experience success, and creativity and resilience are encouraged! Teachers spend each session working with groups and individuals challenging them to think critically and to achieve their goals.



The children in Room 9 are seen here participating in small group guided reading sessions in which each child is supported at their own level. These lessons include many facets of learning to read including phonics, vocabulary, fluency as well as understanding and enjoying the story.





Rooms 7 and 8 are working on their writing, using a letter card to help them sound words out.





Some children in Whānau Wai are writing independently while others are in a workshop with the teacher.





Collaborative reading aloud builds confidence, provides enjoyment, increases attention span, and promotes social connections. Reading to and with someone is a significant part of our reading program.





Jess is running a workshop paragraphing. The children across the whānau signed up to participate, recognising their own needs and knowing their next steps thus taking ownership for their own learning. Children can also be asked by the teachers to join workshops.



Some children in Whānau Kokoru are independently writing chapter stories. They are encouraged to share with their peers; getting feedback and support as they write.



Last week Whānau Wai attended the Kiwi Kapers concert held at the Kiri Te Kanawa Theatre in the Aotea Centre. It was a wonderful opportunity to see the Auckland Philharmonia Orchestra (APO) in collaboration with Massive Theatre Company to explore the lives of three famous New Zealand women. Whānau Wai tāmariki had researched Nancy Wake, Jean Batten and Ruia Morrison prior to the performance. They were able to make connections to their research as highlights of the three wāhine lives were presented through music and drama. Since Ruia Morrison was in the audience, they were also able to see her in person.

The children wrote a response to the experience. Here are a few snippets:

A chatter arose from the crowd as we sat down eagerly. The lights dimmed to purple darkness, making the hum of talk intense. The crowd went wild in appreciation as the conductor walked onto the stage.

Casual Vacancy for an Elected Trustee


A casual vacancy has occurred on the board of trustees for an elected parent representative. The board has decided to fill the vacancy by selection.
