Road Safety

Three road safety issues have been brought to my attention over the past week. The first was by a member of the public who telephoned school to say that she nearly ran over two children coming to school yesterday morning on Roberts Avenue. She gave a great description and the children concerned, and their parents, have been contacted. It would be helpful, however, if you could remind your children about crossing roads safely and in the right place.

The next two concerns are both about road patrol. I enjoyed doing road patrol this morning, with Jahmaine and Troy, both of whom carried out their duties really proficiently. However, it was sad to see several parents dashing across the road with their children rather than using the crossing. If we want our children to develop the habits which will keep them safe when they are out and about without us, it is important that we model them. Please, if you are bringing your child to school and have to cross Bayswater Avenue, use the crossing.

The second road patrol issue was brought up by one of the parents who helps the children with road patrol duty. One morning last week, cars were parking so close to the crossing that it was impossible for the patrollers to see down the road so that they could put out the signs safely. Please, if you are dropping your child off or collecting them from school in the car, park well away from the crossing.
