Waterwise Instructors Course

Parents of children years 1-4. I know it seems a long way off now, but in year 6 your child will be learning to sail through the schools waterwise program. The program is run by parent volunteers, a lot of whom are not experienced sailors. This is a great way to do parent help on a Wednesday afternoon, 12-2:30, terms 1 & 2.

There is an instructors course starting May 11th, where you will learn to sail, kayak, and operate a small inflatable motor boat. Remember, no experience is required, just an enjoyment of water based activities. There is no financial outlay, depending on personal preference for gear. Our instructor numbers are low and are getting lower by the year as families move on. It is also great to start early to get some experience under your wing before your child gets to year 6 They can be impressed by what you know.

Please seriously consider this as instructor numbers dictate how many children we can have on the water at any given time and this affects how much they accomplish. We do not do water based activities when the weather is bad. You are welcome to come along on a Wednesday afternoon if you want to check it out.




Takapuna AFC Holiday Programme
