Adopt a Park

Bayswater School has been invited to join the Adopt a Park School Partnership Programme. This is a wonderful opportunity for students to learn about their local park, learn outside of the classroom and do something good for the community and environment.

Today the enviro group are learning all about the biodiversity of the park at O'Neill's Cemetery.













Snippets from the enviro group's independent writing on return to school:

As the bell rang over the loudspeaker for lunch, the enviro group with the volunteering adults walked down to Philomel's reserve, right next to O'Neill's cemetery. As we entered the Bayswater Reserve we felt a flash of excitement burning inside us. But there was one thing that was slightly disturbing. Weeds! Anna Baines, the park ranger shared her knowledge of plant biodiversity and unwanted weeds that were invading New Zealand. We learnt that there were around 2,000 plant pests that got exported from heaps of different countries and continents. Anna then showed us different kinds of weeds. We weeded the kikuyu grass that is completely smothering plants planted by Bayswater School in 2019. Some roots were feisty but some came out easily! There was lots of team work and we couldn't have done it without each other.





The enviro group will be able to share their new knowledge of the area when the whole school heads to the park to plant trees for Matariki on Tuesday 6th July. As always we are looking forward to our amazing whānau supervising and assisting our tamariki. Please let the class teacher know if you can help.

On this day we will also celebrate the growth of the herbs in our garden! The children will have the opportunity to cut some herbs which they can then add to a choice of mashed potato or rice. They'll need a bowl and a spoon!
