Covid and the Current Situation

At Bayswater School we continue to maintain our Whānau team bubbles, keep our spaces well-ventilated, wear masks, sanitise and get outside as much as possible!. As you will have heard a number of schools across New Zealand Aotearoa have had or are managing Covid cases. In the event we have to close all or part of the school, Learning from Home will occur. This will include class hui, literacy and maths lessons as well as some suggested activities for each day. If all the teachers in a Whānau Team are sick this may look a little different and may include hard pack activities (worksheets).

If your child is absent from school awaiting test results they can access StudyLadder (Y3-6), STEPsWeb (Y3-4), EPIC (Y1-6), as well as reading at home and writing stories.

CO₂ Levels

Our CO2 monitor arrived last week and I'm pleased to confirm that our classrooms fall well within the optimal air quality indoor range of 420 - 999ppm (parts per million). The levels in the classrooms have consistently been in the 430 - 530ppm range! 420 is fresh outdoor air so I think we can be pretty happy with these results!







Parent and Caregiver Information Evening

This year's information evening was held online which turned out to be quite successful as it allowed whānau to join from any location! The focus was on the teaching of reading, writing and mathematics which of course are the core curriculum areas and are a key part of the school day. These are the foundation skills that enable us to access other parts of the curriculum and to do so much more. The teachers also talked about "Assessment for Learning" and how it dictates teaching and learning. We use the same standardised tests used in the majority of schools in New Zealand Aotearoa, I will share more on this in a later newsletter. We had over 63 families join us on the night. Thank you for the interest you've shown in your children's learning, they will notice it also and it will inspire them! The slide shows will be put on the website later this week. Teachers would welcome any questions you've thought of after the event.

Caretaker / Swimming Pool


