Kiwaha: Me whakaute tātou ētahi i atu - We should respect others



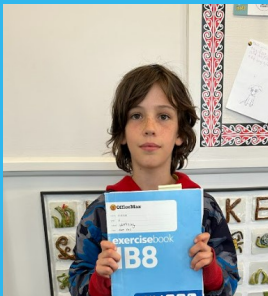
Book Battle

Absences

Is/are your child/ren arriving at school after the bell?

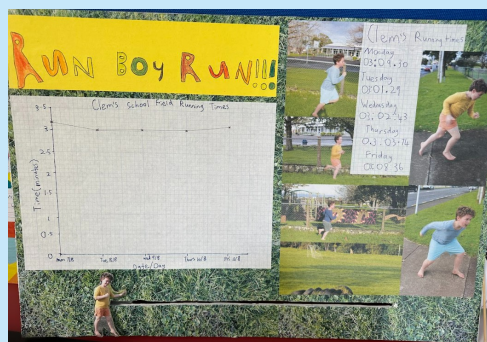
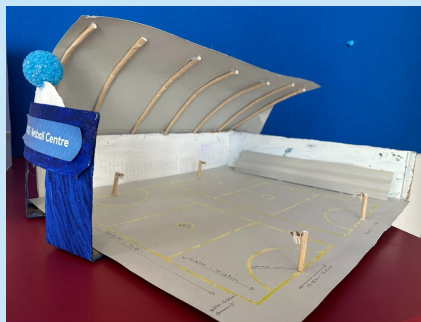

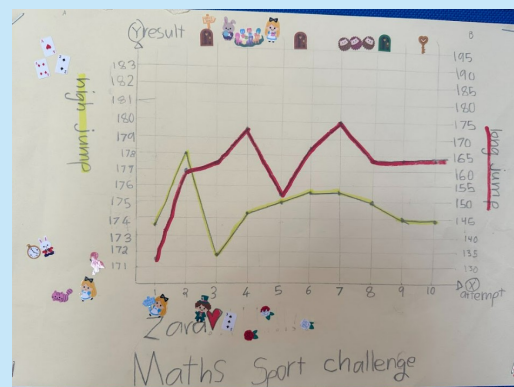
Join us and take a moment for te reo Māori as we acknowledge the past, celebrate the present, and prepare for the future.
