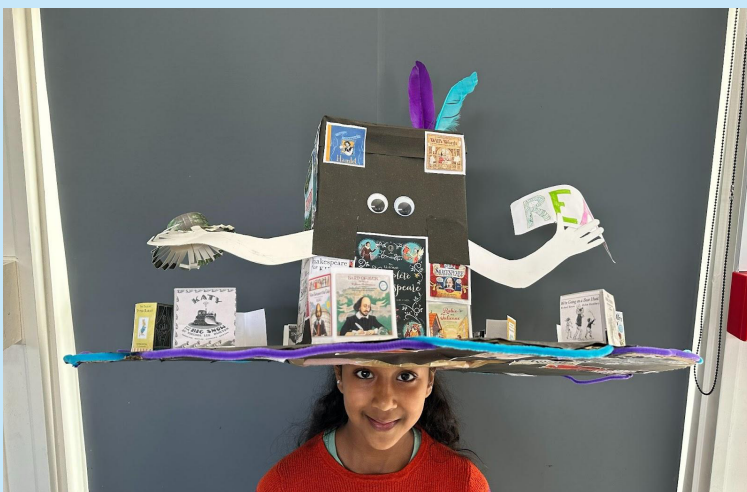

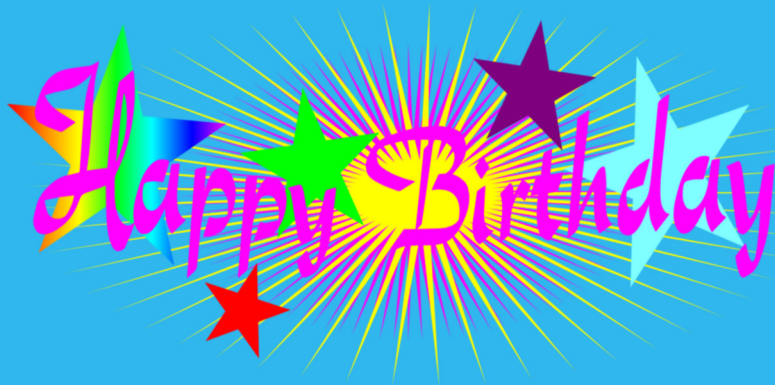
Join us and take a moment for te reo Māori as we acknowledge the past, celebrate the present, and prepare for the future.
