As a ferry user who often cycles to and from school along Bayswater Avenue, I know from my own experience that there are real concerns about the safety of cycling along Bayswater Avenue. I often resort to travelling along the pavement for fear of being knocked off by speeding motorists. It appears I am not alone. Below is a message from Steve McLuckie, one of our parents.

The safety of people, particularly children, along Bayswater Avenue was a concern that emerged from the recent Bayswater and Belmont Community Wellbeing Survey. There's an opportunity for the local community to push for positive change through the Lake Road Improvements Consultation. Walking and Cycling Improvements along Bayswater Avenue are being considered as part of that process. Auckland Transport Staff will be coming along to listen to concerns and there'll be discussion on what else we can do.


