Keeping Our Kids Safe Crossing the Road:



Each day before and after school, a team of children and adults goes out on road patrol to see everyone safely across Bayswater Avenue. It is really disconcerting when some children, accompanied by a parent or care giver, do not use the crossing but dash across from between parked cars just a little further up the road. We are trying to teach all of our children to be safe on the roads, particularly when they are old enough to be about and about without an adult. It really helps us to get this message across if all the adults around school model this for the children. We would be very grateful if you would use the crossing too.

Staff Carpark:

As mentioned in a previous newsletter, the new pathways are now complete so there is no reason for any child to be walking through the carpark. The children have all been shown where to go to park their bikes and scooters and how to walk from the front of the school to the back. Please support us to keep the children safe and refrain from taking your child through the carpark.

Your child needs a hat in order to participate in any outdoor activities from the start of next week.
