### Cohort Entry - Important reminder for parents of four year olds

If your child is due to turn five this year, please remember that all of the Peninsula primary schools in the Community of Learning (Bayswater, Vauxhall, Belmont Primary, Stanley Bay and Devonport) have introduced 'cohort entry'. This means that children may only start school at the beginning of a school term. If your child turns five in the first half of the term, s/he is allowed to start school at the beginning of that term (ie when s/he is still four and about to turn five). Irene (in the office) can give you the exact cut off date for each term – don't forget to find out when you return your enrolment forms. The one exception to this is for children who are transferring into the area and switching schools.

The new government has indicated that it will make some changes to the recently introduced cohort entry system. This may mean that children will be allowed to start school at the beginning of the term after they have turned five. Please watch the newsletter for updates which I will include when I know more.

Thanks to everyone who came along to our first school assembly of the year, last Friday. Assemblies take place every Friday in the hall just after 9am and are a celebration of what we have been learning. Please come along if you can!
