### **Important News**

Below is a message from the NZEI (Teachers' Union) about meetings which the teachers will be attending during school time.



You may be aware of the nationwide crisis in recruiting and retaining teachers. Children need teachers with enough time to teach so they can give each child the attention they deserve, and children need talented and inspiring people to be attracted to teaching. Children are missing out on some opportunities to learn because teachers are bogged down in administration or are struggling to get enough support for children with additional learning needs.

Teachers at our school are joining an NZEI Te Riu Roa campaign, called Kua Tae Te Wā – It's Time to address these issues. Our goal is to free teachers to teach, and principals to lead, by getting the additional support and staff that schools need. We will also attract more people to teaching by respecting and paying them as the professionals they are.

NZEI Te Riu Roa members at our school have been invited to paid union meetings in March so that we can plan and discuss the campaign and their upcoming collective agreement negotiations. The meeting schedule has been planned so that teachers and principals across the country can work out the best meetings for them to attend, including the option of groups of teachers attending meetings at different times. This is to help reduce disruption to teaching programmes, children and parents.

Our children deserve the best education in the world, and New Zealand can afford to provide it. It's just a matter of priorities. Thanks for your co-operation in this important matter

The teachers at Bayswater School will be attending Paid Union Meetings on Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> March. Half will go in the morning and then return to school and half will be at school in the morning and attend in the afternoon. This is so that we can ensure that the children who are at school on the day are safely cared for. We have chosen to attend meetings on a Friday because we are conscious that some families may choose to keep their children off school and have a long weekend. If this is your choice, please let the office know in the usual way (before hand if possible).

# **Recycling Phones**

This year our school is trying very hard to once again be the best we can be to take care of the environment. One way we can do this is to recycle old phones.

Most cell phones contains valuable metal and plastics that can be recycled to save energy and resources that would otherwise be required to manufacture. When placed in a landfill these materials can pollute the air and contaminate soil and drinking water.

The dumping of mobile phones are dangerous to the environment. Many compartments of mobile phones like arsenic, lithium, cadmium, copper, lead, mercury and zinc are considered toxic. These poisonous substances may leach from decomposing waste in landfills, seep into groundwater and contaminate the soil.

Recycling is very important as waste has a huge negative impact on the natural environment. Harmful chemicals and greenhouse gases are released from rubbish in landfill sites. Recycling helps to reduce the pollution caused by waste. Recycling reduces the need for raw materials so that the forests can be preserved.
