Important News

Below is a message from the NZEI (Teachers' Union) about meetings which the teachers will be attending during school time.



You may be aware of the nationwide crisis in recruiting and retaining teachers. Children need teachers with enough time to teach so they can give each child the attention they deserve, and children need talented and inspiring people to be attracted to teaching. Children are missing out on some opportunities to learn because teachers are bogged down in administration or are struggling to get enough support for children with additional learning needs.

Teachers at our school are joining an NZEI Te Riu Roa campaign, called Kua Tae Te Wā – It's Time to address these issues. Our goal is to free teachers to teach, and principals to lead, by getting the additional support and staff that schools need. We will also attract more people to teaching by respecting and paying them as the professionals they are.

NZEI Te Riu Roa members at our school have been invited to paid union meetings in March so that we can plan and discuss the campaign and their upcoming collective agreement negotiations. The meeting schedule has been planned so that teachers and principals across the country can work out the best meetings for them to attend, including the option of groups of teachers attending meetings at different times. This is to help reduce disruption to teaching programmes, children and parents.

Our children deserve the best education in the world, and New Zealand can afford to provide it. It's just a matter of priorities. Thanks for your co-operation in this important matter

The teachers at Bayswater School will be attending Paid Union Meetings on Friday 23rd March. Half will go in the morning and then return to school and half will be at school in the morning and attend in the afternoon. This is so that we can ensure that the children who are at school on the day are safely cared for. We have chosen to attend meetings on a Friday because we are conscious that some families may choose to keep their children off school and have a long weekend. If this is your choice, please let the office know in the usual way (before hand if possible).

Eat Right Be Bright - School Lunch for All Kiwi Kids

I was recently approached by some local Mums who are campaigning for all children to be fed a healthy, nutritious meal in the middle of the school day. I am sure that some of you will agree with this idea and others would prefer a more 'targeted' approach. Whatever your view, it is an interesting idea so I thought I would share the information with you so you can make up your own mind.

"We are a group of 160+ ordinary local Mums who have started the Eat Right Be Bright campaign asking the Government to provide funding and resources for a daily fresh healthy and nutritious lunch for every child at school and in early childhood education in New Zealand. Why have we started this?

We believe passionately that all children are our children. That all children in New Zealand, wherever they are, whatever their circumstances, have the right to access their education on an equal footing and to nutritious food to nourish their minds, lives and spirits. We are deeply concerned that:

- 1 in 4 of our children in New Zealand are living in poverty.
- 1 in 3 of our children in New Zealand are overweight or obese.
- 1 in 3 of all children admitted to Starship Hospital are malnourished to some degree.

We say, this stops now. Charities providing food in some schools are stretched more and more each year and our children deserve the dignity of a secured and permanent school lunch. Only with a centrally funded, secured, school lunch programme for all kids in New Zealand will we reach every child in need, free from shame and stigma. .

The big plus is that all our children will benefit from the health and education uplift provided by a school lunch programme. For the children most in need, that uplift is greatest. We all know that better educated and healthier children benefits all New Zealanders with less children needing doctors and more children being doctors.




School-gen's Energising Young Minds Competition
