Teacher Shortages and Contract Negotiations

On Tuesday 19th June the teachers' union (NZEI) has called for a teachers' meeting to present the Ministry of Education's offer regarding the teachers' contract negotiations. At this meeting, teachers will vote to accept or reject the offer.

Teachers who are union members have a legal right to attend this meeting. We ask that parents and whanau who are able to please collect their children from school at 12:50 pm on Tuesday 19th June.

If you would like your child to walk home unaccompanied at 12:50 on this day, please email the office at <u>admin@bayswater.school.nz</u>. Children who must remain at school will be supervised and can be collected at the normal time from the hall.

- Over the past six years, there has been a 40% drop-off in those training to teach
- 40% of new teachers leave the profession in the first five years
- 35% of our experienced teachers will be eligible to retire during the next 10 years and many are leaving early



The Minister of Education Chris Hipkins has described recruitment and retention of teachers as "a ticking time bomb".

Our children deserve the best education. However, that can only happen when there is a supply of committed, talented teachers and principals. A successful outcome to the current teacher contract negotiations is central to addressing this teacher shortage.

We are hoping that we can rely on the support of our community in this critical matter. We know from past experience, such as when the Ministry tried to increase class sizes, that when the community is behind us we have a much stronger voice.

Pink Shirt Day

Last week at school, children were learning about bullying. The first step was to define the problem.

So far, the children have come up with the following -

Unkindness counts as bullying if it is:

- ongoing / repeated / happens many times;
- mean / hurtful;
- deliberate / on purpose / intentional / not an accident;
- difficult for the target to stand up for themselves for some reason.

Bullying can take many forms. It can be:

- physical hurting your body;
 - verbal saying unkind or untrue things;
 - emotional;
 - cyber.

Over the coming weeks the School Council is going to be discussing this further and then designing and producing a new antibullying poster for school.
